



Figure 1: The multi-level perspective

on opportunities for the phasing out of animal procedures and the stimulation of innovation without laboratory animals


Opinion of the Netherlands National Committee for the protection of animals used for scientific purposes (NCad)





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2. NCad working method



The Netherlands Minister
of Agriculture, the Central
Authority for Scientific
Procedures on Animals (CCD),
an Animal Welfare Body or another
organisation requests an opinion



NCad discusses the request and informs the organisation as to how it will proceed with the request



NCad decides to issue an opinion on its own initiative



NCad draws up an action plan for each opinion that it agrees to prepare, and publishes it on the NCad website



The opinion is presented to the Dutch Minister for Agriculture who forwards it, along with a policy response, to the Dutch House of Representatives



A final version of the opinion is agreed at an NCad meeting



from national and international experts through working groups and consultations of community groups




Two NCad members are chosen to spearhead the preparation of the opinion, supported by the secretariat

The opinions are published on the NCad website



2. Transition advice working method





Transition to non-animal research > pressure cooker

- assisted by expert in transition management
- 2 highly interactive multidisciplinary workshops, led by NCad
- narrative review of literature, opinion papers, news journals
- consultation of experts
- online discussion group on LinkedIn
- student project
- consultation of 16 community groups (5 animal welfare + 2 NGO/patients + 1 government + 5 research + 3 industry)

NCad formulates own opinion



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


Figure 1: The multi-level perspective





3. The (main) conclusions

- 1. A paradigm shift from 'animals as golden standard' to 'animal free innovation' is necessary.
- 2. Formulate transition goals and targets: phasing out all animal testing for regulatory purposes is possible before 2025.
- 3. Strong management of the transition, based on a clear transition strategy is essential.



Transition targets

 Regulatory required safety testing of chemical substances

including food additives, pesticides and medical products

 Regulatory required testing for the release of pre-clinically assessed biological products
 such as vaccines Regulatory research:

phase out animal use by 2025



(following)

 Each (sub)domain in fields of fundamental research, translational research, applied research and education



Vision, including:

Main scientific questions of the research field, animal models used in this domain (incl welfare), biomedicsal dilemma's, context (including drivers, barriers and stakeholder interests), targets for animal free innovations, strategy and monitoring



Transition strategy

- Initiate international discussion on drastic revision of current regulatory risk assessment process
- Adjust current government innovation policy to a more chainoriented approach encouraging multidisciplinary collaboration
- Invest in valorisation and acceptance of animal-free research methods
- Stimulate ethical use of human subjects for scientific data collection



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






4. Follow up

- RIVM (national institue for public health and the environment): strategy to phasing out in the regulatroy field before 2025
- Science stakeholders like the Royal academy of Sciences: stimulate formulating transition vision in fundamental research.

 - Pilots 'vision on transition target' in the domains of







Lessons learned
